#### The best waste is that which does not arise at all

A high volume of waste, especially from disposable products, means a high consumption of natural resources and energy. The higher the proportion of recyclable materials in disposal, the more environmentally friendly waste disposal can be. A higher recycling rate can be achieved above all through correct waste separation. Currently, waste separation at the University of Hildesheim is partly insufficient and partly non-existent.
